The new Elizabeth line trains







Key features:


- 70 lightweight trains each 200 metres long
- Walk-through carriages with Wi-Fi and 4G
- Space for 1,500 passengers capacity with 454 seats
- MTR to operate Elizabeth line services on an 8 year concession with option to extend to 10 years
- Air Conditioning and real time information on-train
- Energy efficient and intelligent on-train energy management systems
- 4 dedicated wheelchair spaces and 10 multi-use spaces
- Capable of running up to 90mph on outer sections



Property impacts




- Oversite developments 3m square feet of office, retail and residential above 12 Crossrail sites
- £10.6bn (previously £5.5bn) additional residential and commercial property value by 2021
- Support 90,000 (previously 55,000) new homes by 2021
- 4.4m (previously 3.25m) square feet of commercial office floor space by 2021








