

Foreword from The President The Lord Broers FRS FMEDSCI FRENG

May I welcome you to the first Annual Report of the Parliamentary and Scientific Committee in this new Parliamentary Session.

Following the December 2019 General Election, the Parliamentary and Scientific Committee was inaugurated as a new All-Party Parliamentary Group in January 2020 and I was delighted to accept the presidency of the Committee, succeeding Lord Oxburgh who served this Committee and the Lords Science and Technology Select Committee so well for many years.

We were saddened at the loss of our former previous Chairman, Andrew Miller who died in December 2019. He has been greatly missed by his many friends and colleagues.

Founded in 1939, the Committee is the oldest All Party Parliamentary Group and we marked the Committee's 80th Anniversary at our Annual Lunch, held in the House of Lords in January 2020, when we were delighted to welcome our Guest of Honour, Dame Jocelyn Bell Burnell.

At that time we were unaware of the impending Covid pandemic and the extent to which this would affect all our lives. For the past decade we have been aware of the need to have the resources and drugs available to deal with a pandemic such as this and we are extremely fortunate that vaccines have been developed and rolled out with such efficacy.

Covid-19 has meant that we have had to suspend our Discussion Meetings and Dinners in the Houses of Parliament but I am delighted that so many of our Members have been able to participate in the on-line webinars we organised to maintain our activities.

As well as dealing with the present Covid crisis, following Brexit the Government will be looking at strengthening our markets, increasing financial growth and productivity and meeting the challenges of Climate Change including hosting the COP 26 summit in November. Our programme of meetings this year will reflect these priorities.

Scientific and Technical Organisations

An organisation or society shall be eligible for election to the Committee as a Scientific and Technical Organisation if the Council is satisfied that it is either:-

- (i) A National Institution or Association for qualifying scientists, engineers or technologists; or
- (ii) A Research Organisation which is not of a profit-making character, or part of an individual commercial or profit-making undertaking, and which is either directly engaged in natural or social science, pure or applied, or both providing funds for research to be conducted by other bodies and also taking a direct part in determination of the programmes of such research, or
- (iii) A body, the contribution of which to the scientific life of the country makes its membership, in the opinion of the Council, desirable in order to advance the agreed objects of the Committee.

In reaching a decision with regard to eligibility regard shall be had to the extent to which the branch of science, engineering or technology represented by the applicant organisation is already adequately represented on the Committee.

Note: No organisation which had been elected to membership by the Committee prior to January 1963, shall be rendered ineligible for membership under this sub-clause.
